Dear Leader Schumer:

From there, he worked in state government and his passion for public service led him to Yale Law School where he distinguished himself as an active member of that community.

Geoffrey was appointed by President Obama to serve in the United States Department of Justice, the Office of the Deputy Attorney General. In this role, he served as senior counsel (part of the leadership team at the Department of Justice). He advised the Deputy Attorney General on a variety of matters, both domestic and international.
